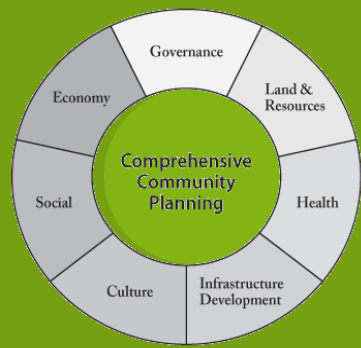
SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT FUNDING PROGRAM MANDATE

- ◎ To promote a better standard of living for all First Nations people.
- ◎ To act as a liaison between First Nations and the Federal and Provincial Governments and other agencies regarding First Nation social development issues.
- ◎ To coordinate information sharing between First Nations in order to enable First Nations to make the best use possible of the increasingly limited financial resources available for social development purposes.



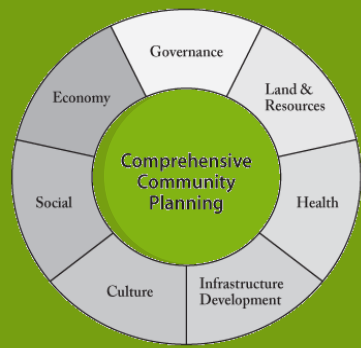
SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT FUNDING PROGRAM MANDATE CONT'D...

- ◎ To coordinate provincial conferences, regional workshops and information workshops on First Nations social development issues.
- ◎ To conduct research on a broad range of social development topic in support of First Nation peoples.
- ◎ To undertake policy discussions with Canada and BC concerning First Nations social development issues.
- ◎ To develop media material so that best practices of First Nations social development activities are shared



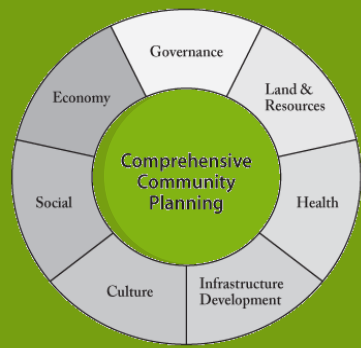

- ◎ **What is Income Assistance:** Income Assistance is a TEMPORARY base for people who need financial help, that have no other access to additional resources.
- ◎ **Where Does Income Assistance Come From?**
- ◎ **Who decides if I qualify for Income Assistance on-reserve?**
- ◎ **How is Income Assistance on-reserve different from Income Assistance off-reserve?**



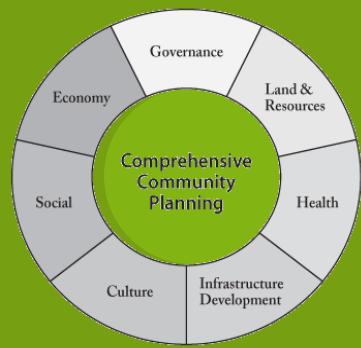

- © **What is a Support Allowance:** A Support Allowance is money for food and other necessary living expenses. A shelter allowance is money to pay for housing, including rent, phone, and utilities for your apartment or house. The Income Assistance Policy determines the maximum amount you can receive for these allowances.

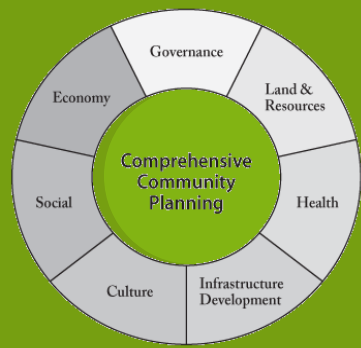
- © **What is a Shelter allowance:** Your Shelter Allowance covers the actual housing costs you're paying right now, up to a maximum allowable amount. Your costs may include: rent, mortgage or house loan payments, heating and utility costs, basic phone services, and if you are eligible, some forms of house and contents insurance.

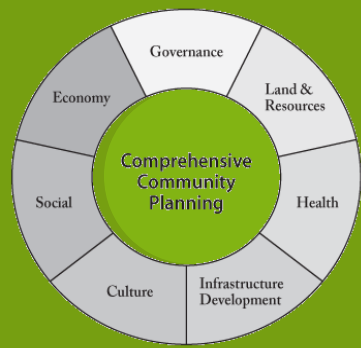
⊙ **The Social Development worker may turn you down for, or discontinue, your regular IA if you:**

Don't have identification, quit a job or lost it because of something you did or caused, aren't looking for work, turned down a job you are capable of taking and doing, are on strike or lock-out from your job, haven't attempted to access other sources of money, or are waiting for other benefits such as Employment Insurance or Workers' Compensation.



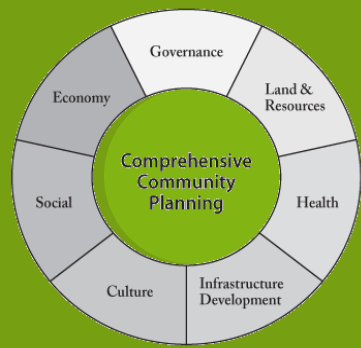

- © **What is Hardship Assistance:** Hardship assistance is a category of assistance for individuals who do not qualify for regular Income Assistance and who can't get money or help from any other source. This assistance only covers basic expenses, like food and housing, and is meant to help you for only a limited period of time. Like regular Income Assistance, hardship assistance includes a support allowance and a shelter allowance based on the unit size of your family.

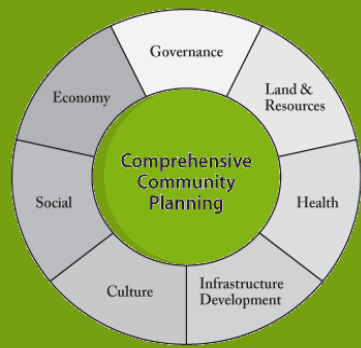
- © **What happens if I am injured or sick and I am temporarily unable to work or look for work?**
Persons with Multiple Barriers (PPMB): PPMB benefits may provide additional Income Assistance money and benefits if you are unable to achieve financial independence because you have specific medical problems that prevent you from working or looking for work.

- ◎ **Persons With Disabilities (PWD)** PWD may provide additional money and benefits if you are unable to work or look for work due to a long-term disability.

Qualifications and requirements vary program to program; please contact your local Social Services Department staff for further detail.

- ◎ **Special & Supplementary Allowances:** Incentive Allowance; Special Needs Allowance; Natal Allowance; Infant Formula Allowance; Diet Allowance; Monthly Nutritional Allowance; Tube Feed Allowance; Camp Fee Allowance; December Supplementary Allowance; School Start-up Allowance; Work Clothes/ Work Transportation Benefit; Workforce Entry Benefit; Moving Costs; Special Transportation; Guide Dog Allowance;

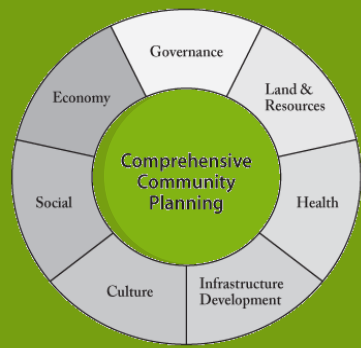

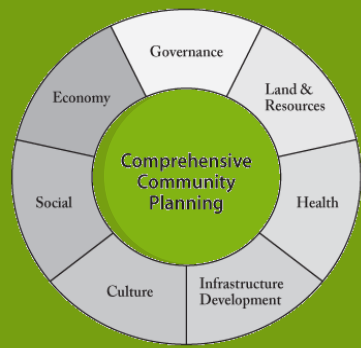

 - ⊙ Non– Status Health Benefits (NSHB),
 - ⊙ Family Bonus Top-up Allowance,

 - ⊙ Adult-In-Home Care,
 - ⊙ Adult Institutional Care Benefits,
 - ⊙ Transition to Employment Programs

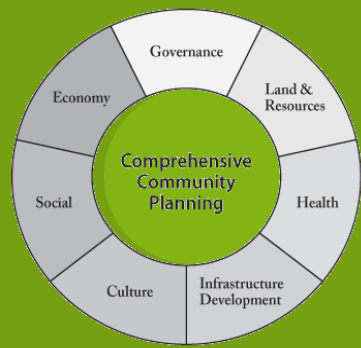
CCP: SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

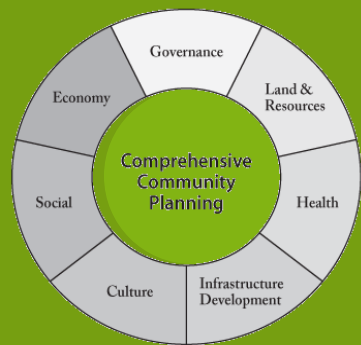

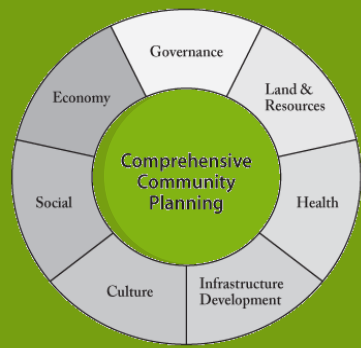
CCP: SOCIAL ISSUES

- © **SOCIAL ISSUES:** are matters which directly or indirectly affect a person or many members of a society and are considered to be problems, controversies related to moral values, or both.



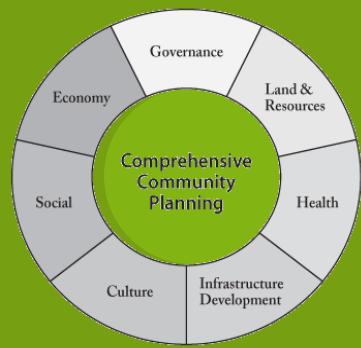

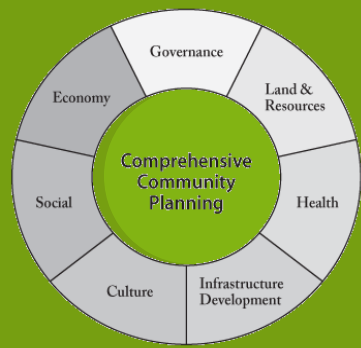

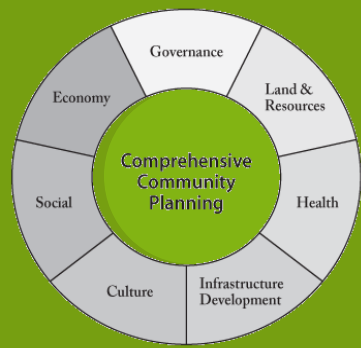

- ◎ **EXAMPLE:** Effective and Efficient Government that Supports Social Services Department.
- ◎ *Objectives to Reach Goal:* Department participation presentation, Chief & Council, entities, community members; Collective work plans; develop 5 year work plan; develop good working relationship between departmental manager and Chief & Council; Follow policies when making decisions; open talks with Chief & Council and entities and community members.



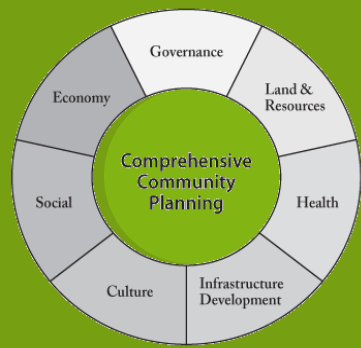

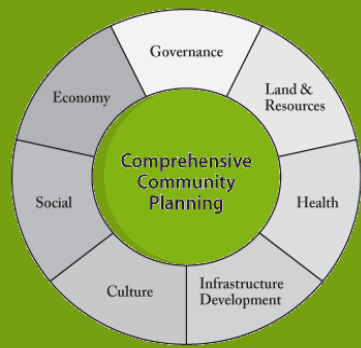
- ◎ **PROGRAMS:** “A system of services, opportunities, or projects, usually designed to meet a social need.” – Source: Dictionary.com

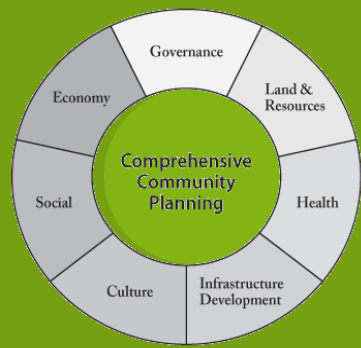
◎ DAKELH LANGUAGE & CULTURE:
